TO PROVIDE DISASTER DEBRIS COLLECTION AND REMOVAL FOR ANY NATURAL, HUMAN-CAUSED DISASTER OR EMERGENCY SITUATION OCCURRING WITHIN THE NEXT FIVE YEARS; REPEALING RESOLUTIONS OR PARTS OF RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Dougherty County, Georgia is hereby desirous of approving and executing a Procurement Recommendation between Dougherty County and Ceres Environmental Services, Inc. to provide disaster debris collection and removal for any natural, human-caused disaster or emergency situation occurring during the next five years.

RECOMMENDATION:

Consider for approval a five-year contract with Ceres Environmental Services, Inc. of Sarasota, FL to perform disaster debris removal services on an as needed basis.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Request for Proposals Ref. #19-028R was advertised in the Albany Herald, on the local access channel, and Georgia Procurement Registry. The proposal closing date was January 23, 2019. Responses were received from seventeen (17) firms. The Proposal Analysis Group consisting of Jeremy Brown, County Engineering, Larry Cook, County Public Works Director and Scott Addison, County Solid Waste; evaluated the submittals based on the following criteria: Past Performance, Firm Qualifications & Experience, Project Approach, Technical Approach/Proposal Quality and Price Proposal/Fee Schedule. The recommendation of the PAG is to contract with Ceres Environmental Services, Inc. The County will utilize the unit pricing that was provided in the proposal.

Contract shall be for one (1) year with four (4) options to renew for additional one-year terms per O.C.G.A 36-60-13. This contract will cover any Disaster that might occur.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Dougherty County, Georgia is hereby desirous of approving and executing a contract between Dougherty County and Tetra Tech, Inc. for the purpose of providing monitoring services for disaster debris management.

DOUGHERTY COUNTY, GEORGIA TASK ORDER No. 2-2019-H/Michael-Monitoring

In accordance with the Notice-to-Proceed dated February _____, 2019 issued by Dougherty County, Georgia (the "County") to **Tetra Tech, Inc.** (Tetra Tech), the County hereby authorizes the services to be performed for the period of performance and estimated budget set forth herein:

PROJECT: Disaster Debris Management Services – Phase II

2018 Hurricane Michael

DURATION OF WORK:

Estimated project term: **February** ______ **2019** through **April 30, 2019** or until the funds have been expended in full, whichever first occurs. The period of performance may be extended upon approval by both parties. To the extent the period of performance is required to be extended due to reasons beyond the Tetra Tech Team's control; such unforeseen circumstances may result in an increase in the project timeline and budget.

SCOPE:

Tetra Tech shall provide the following services:

- a. Hiring, scheduling, training and managing field monitoring staff.
- b. Certifying contractor vehicles and mutual aid vehicles for debris removal using methodology and documentation practices appropriate for contract monitoring.
- c. Monitoring and documenting debris removal contractor operations.
- d. Developing operational reports to keep the County informed of work progress.
- e. Review and reconciliation of debris removal contractor invoices prior to submission to the County for processing.

ESTIMATED COST (not to exceed)

Initial Not-to Exceed Amount: \$359,179.50

The fee for the services will be based on the actual hours of services furnished multiplied by Tetra Tech's hourly rates plus all non-labor expenses as set forth in the Master Services Agreement between the County and Tetra Tech. The table below outlines the anticipated staff positions and level of effort for this assignment.

The above estimated level of effort and associated costs are based on available information at the time the estimates were prepared and do not represent the actual cost of the project. Due to the uncertain nature of the work involved, Tetra Tech cannot guarantee that the work will be performed within the estimated amount provided above. If, during the performance of this work, it is determined additional hours, expenses and/or funding is required in order to complete the project, Tetra Tech and the County will mutually agree on a new/revised estimated cost and Tetra Tech will not proceed without written authorization from an authorized representative of the County.

Non-labor expenses shall be invoiced as follows: (1) travel expenses including airfare and car rental shall be invoiced at cost without mark-up; (2) lodging shall be invoiced up to the per diem rate according to the General Services Administration (GSA) rates established at www.gsa.gov (3) meals and incidentals shall be invoiced at the GSA per diem rate (no receipts are required); (4) mileage shall be invoiced at the federally published rate; and (5) other required non-labor expenses as may be applicable to the project and pre-approved by the County and Tetra Tech shall be invoiced at cost without mark-up.

PROJECT ASSUMPTIONS:

- a. Initial debris estimate of 100,000 cubic yards (CY)
- b. Preliminary cost estimate is based on an average of ten (10) debris contractor loading units operating for 37 days with an average of 45 CY per load and six (6) loads a day.
- c. Assumption of two (2) debris management sites being utilized by the debris contractor
- d. Estimate assumes 10 days of haul-out following completion of ROW Collection
- e. Changes to these assumptions, expansion of scope of work, or debris contractor efficiency may impact the preliminary cost estimate and warrant a request for an increase by Tetra Tech.
